## International War Crimes



Abeer Hasan is a Legal Officer / Appeals Counsel at the United Nations with the Office of the Prosecutor at the International Residual Mechanism for Criminal Tribunals (IRMCT). Ms. Hasan currently provides direct case assistance to national war crimes prosecutors and prepares cases for transfer to war crimes offices in the former Yugoslavia. Ms. Hasan has worked on the appeals of the former President Radovan Karadzic and General Ratko Mladic, former commander of the Bosnian Serb Army. Prior to that, Ms. Hasan was a Trial Attorney with the Office of the Prosecutor of the International Criminal Tribunal for the Former Yugoslavia (ICTY) and worked on the investigation and prosecution of Generals Ratko Mladic and Zdravko Tolimir, each convicted of war crimes, crimes against humanity and genocide, arising from the war in the former Yugoslavia. Her work has focused on Srebrenica related crimes. Ms. Hasan served as a member of the start-up team for the International, Impartial and Independent Mechanism for Syria. Before joining the

ICTY, Ms. Hasan worked for the Defence at the International Criminal Court and practiced civil litigation in Canada.
